• QAST – Smart Choices Guidelines

Dear QAST Member,

Due to recent changes in the Department of Education and Training's position on the updated **2016 Smart Choices Ready Reckoner**, please find below confirmation of the current status of the Smart Choices Healthy Food and Drink Supply Strategy as communicated to the Association.

- The Smart Choices Healthy Food and Drink Supply Strategy for Queensland Schools released in 2005 remains mandatory for state schools and encouraged in non-state schools.
- In 2016, changes were made to the way some food and drinks are classified under Smart Choices to align
 more closely with the <u>National Healthy School Canteens Guidelines</u> and the <u>Australian Dietary Guidelines</u>.
 These changes are reflected in the *Updated 2016 Smart Choices Ready Reckoner*. State schools are
 encouraged to implement these changes. There is no mandatory timeline for the implementation of these
 changes.

Our team at QAST understands there may have been some confusion at your school and shares our members' frustration with the way the changes have been released and communicated. Frequently asked questions about Smart Choices...

Do I still have to follow Smart Choices?

Yes. The original Smart Choices strategy remains mandatory for State Schools and is encouraged for non-state schools.

Do I have to implement the changes in the Updated 2016 Ready Reckoner?

No because here is no longer a mandatory timeline for the implementation of these changes. The changes are based on the National Healthy School Canteens Guidelines and the Australian Dietary Guidelines, so all schools are encouraged to make the changes for the health and well being of their students.

QAST encourages Principals and P&C Associations to discuss the value they place on providing a supportive environment for the health and well being of their students and to determine which version of the Ready Reckoner should be utilised by the tuckshop.
